



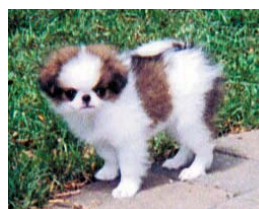
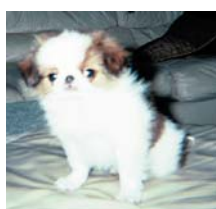
**A New Warger-Eavy Has Arrived!**

# Welcome Oliver!

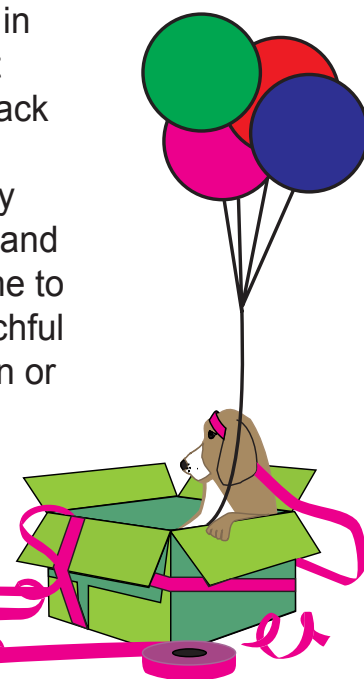
